5. Membership and Board Recruitment

Robert reminded everyone to please join the SCNA. Annual membership dues are only \$20 per calendar year for new and continuing members. We really should get a good-sized base of paid, voting members to participate in decision making for the organization (according to by-laws). Carole and Tom paid dues tonight.

Likewise, we need a few more Board members, especially a secretary. One of the first things we want to do as a Board will be to review the By-laws to make sure they fit our NA, and can't do this until we have a full Board.

Robert is trying to communicate with the internal HOAs (Meridian Woods, Capistrano Townhomes, etc.) to get emails and add members to SNCA Database.

Dave suggested multi-lingual information on fliers and as part of emails, for those who do not speak English. Robert will look into what languages are most needed and how to translate.

6. Street Sweeping

Most of neighborhood is not aware that sweeping is the first Tuesday of the month. The homeowners are notified, and don't inform the tenants in the rentals. This is why we want to get fliers out.

Volunteers are needed to distribute, hopefully prior to Feb. 27th, Dumpster Day.

Dave suggested permanent signage for street sweeping. As discussed in Jan. there is no money in the City budget for signage.

7. Feb. 27th – Cleanup Day (a.k.a. "Dumpster Day")

ACTION ITEM: Robert to inquire where the dumpsters will be and ask if the Councilman's office will be informing residents. NOTE: Two days after meeting. Postcards arrived in the mail announcing this info.

8. Open Forum/New Business/Announcements

- There is still a Window Tinting sign on a telephone pole on Albany at Richfield. It's too high for anyone to remove. Discussed how to remove it. It is illegal and has been there for months. Robert is planning to report it as part of the illegal sign cleanup on Feb. 27th. It was also suggested that the telephone company/PG&E can be called and informed. They may remove it at no cost to the city. Carol suggested reporting it to Actionline.
- Carole brought up possibility of Code Enforcement coming out to do a walk-through of the neighborhood. Robert reminded people of the budget constraints, and also the need for list of problem locations that no one has reported since asked a few months ago. A discussion ensued about what types of things are code violations, junk on private property, overgrown yards, abandoned items, etc.
- REMINDER: February 27th - Neighborhood Cleanup Day (a.k.a. "Dumpster Day"). Dumpsters will be placed throughout District 1, and in our neighborhood, for people to discard their

unwanted stuff, at NO COST. More information about locations will be available at our website (www.stevenscreekna.com).

- REMINDER: February 27th – 2nd Annual Illegal Sign Clean Up Day. 9:00 am-12:00pm. Volunteers are needed to go through District 1 to help remove illegally posted signs that are a blight in our neighborhood. Details will be available on our website (www.stevenscreekna.com)
